About the Artists



John Young Shik Concklin, conductor

This concert is the North Carolina Symphony debut for John Young Shik Concklin.

John Young Shik Concklin is Music Director of the Spartanburg Philharmonic and Hendersonville Symphony Orchestra. He also serves as Conductor with the Atlanta Music Project, an El Sistema organization focused on social justice and music, and the Piedmont Chamber Orchestra, a mentoring orchestra for high school and collegiate musicians.

Previous positions include associate conductor of the Georgia Symphony Orchestra, assistant conductor of the Cleveland Pops Orchestra, and faculty appointments at Vanderbilt, Clemson, Furman, and Converse universities. He has been a fellowship conductor at the Aspen Music Festival, a teaching assistant at the Brevard Music Center, and a finalist at the New World Symphony and Debut Orchestra.

Concklin has been a finalist for the 2019/20 American Prize in Conducting. He has competed internationally at the Almaty, the Nino Rota, and the Città di Brescia international conducting competitions. He is also regularly invited to cover-conduct for the Nashville and Kansas City symphonies and the Atlanta Symphony Orchestra.

A flexible musician, Concklin has also performed at the Super Bowl halftime show and has collaborated with Monica, a Grammy-winning R&B artist.

Concklin studied at Vanderbilt University, Yale University, and the Cleveland Institute of Music. His mentors include David Zinman, Carl Topilow, Shin-ik Hahm, and Robin Fountain. He received further training from Lorin Maazel and Michael Tilson-Thomas.

Concklin and his wife, Lauren Maxwell, co-founded Mozart for a Cause, a multi genre chamber music concert that fundraises for local causes.



Maiya Sykes, vocalist

This concert is the North Carolina Symphony debut for Maiya Sykes.

Maiya Sykes has appeared with artists including the Black Eyed Peas, Macy Gray, Fantasia, Joss Stone, Micahel Bublé, Leona Lewis, and Rita Ora and was featured in the Oscar-winning film *La La Land*. As a recording artist, she released a dance single with DJ Manny Lehman, "Body Rock," recorded under the pseudonym Oceana, which reached number 1 on the *Billboard* Dance Charts in 2009.

Shortly after her four-chair-turning debut on season seven of *The Voice*, Sykes began working with YouTube sensation Postmodern Jukebox. Her featured videos with Postmodern Jukebox have received over three million views.



Ty Taylor, *vocalist*

This concert is the North Carolina Symphony debut for Ty Taylor.

Ty Taylor is the lead singer for the Soul Rock band Vintage Trouble. Taylor has led a diverse musical career, singing on soundtracks of HBO's *Vinyl* and the film *The Color Purple* and appearing as a contestant on the reality show *Rock Star: INXS*.

On stage, Taylor has toured with artists including Tina Turner, Eric Clapton, & Macy Gray. With his group Vintage Trouble, Taylor has supported rock acts like Lenny Kravitz, Bon Jovi, AC/DC, and The Who. Most recently Taylor appeared in the role of St. Jimmy in a production of the Green Day musical *American Idiot*.
